14th Annual Banquet-October 19th, 2013

The Delaware Aviation Hall of Fame (DAHF) was established to honor Delaware's aviation greats and to promote public recognition of the role of flight in the progress of The First State. Each year the DAHF holds a banquet to recognize the men and women who have given uniquely and generously of their mind, heart, energy and time in building aviation in Delaware. Since it was established in 2000, there have been 78 Inductees.

This year the DAHF will hold its fourteenth honors banquet at the University of Delaware's Clayton Hall on Saturday, October 19. Six adults will be inducted to the Hall of Fame: Allen Chorman, James Fiorelli, Joseph Hudson, John Pavlock, Rogelio Rodriguez, Jr., and Stephanie Wright. Over 300 people are expected to attend.



Following dinner, this year's wingmen (DAHF trustees) will introduce their respective inductees to the assembly, using large-screen visual presentations as part of their induction ceremony. DAHF President Jim Hickin will confer the ribbon medallions and award plaques to the inductees. This year's class brings the total number of inductees to 84 since the inaugural year 2000.



The gala affair kicks off with a reception starting at 5:00 PM. Exhibits featuring memorabilia of the inductees will be displayed in the reception area along with aviation-related paintings, past inductees' displays, aircraft models, etc. The opening ceremony commences at 6:00, with a bagpiper leading the procession of the Civil Air Patrol Color Guard followed by the inductees and their wingmen.

Allen Chorman, Milton With his diverse aerial applications company, has made a real difference in the strength of Delaware agriculture and aviation; proactively developed Chorman Airport for public use to serve the general aviation community; has accrued over 30,000 hours of accident-free flying.



James V. Fiorelli, Colonel, USAF (Deceased), Wilmington Flew 20 continuous months of combat in South Vietnam; 30 year career fighter pilot, with leadership roles at squadron and group levels; graduate of Salesianum High School and U.S. Air Force Academy; died on active duty.



Joseph R. Hudson, Milton Strong champion of the First State's agricultural industry and the professionalism of its supporting aviation community; longtime aviator, regional aerial agricultural and mosquito spraying business entrepreneur, land developer, farmer, and philanthropist.



John Pavlock, Wilmington In 1991 flew 36 combat missions over Iraq during Operation Desert Storm, earning a Distinguished Flying Cross and 3 Air Medals; 20 years' experience as a combat fighter pilot on active duty and with the Air National Guard; graduate of the U.S. Air Force Academy.



Rogelio Rodriguez, Jr., Major, DANG, Bear – As an aeromedical evacuation flight nurse in the DE Air National Guard, logged over 150 combat missions and almost 700 combat flying hours transporting over 2,000 wounded to needed medical care; has 25 years of military service, 14 years as a nurse.



Stephanie M.G.Wright, Ed.D, Bear Early NASA Teacher-in-Space-Program finalist; founded the Delaware Aero-Space Education Foundation (DASEF), an independent non-profit body, to raise the visibility and value of K-12 STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) education.
